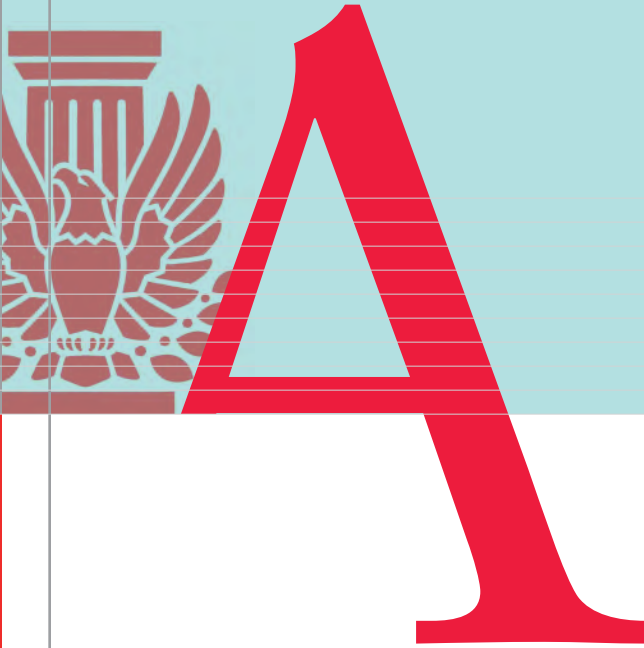

2016-17 Design Awards

The AIA ENY Design Awards took place on March 2nd at the Troy Arts Center. Distinguished jurors from the AIA Vermont Chapter deliberated nearly 25 submissions and awarded a total of seven awards across five categories; *residential (single family detached), historic preservation, unbuilt, institutional, and adaptive reuse*.

As the design awards committee chair and co-chair for the past several years, I can't remember a more well attended event. I contribute this to both our members and to our Master of Ceremonies, Philip Morris, CEO of Proctors. Before announcing the awards and providing each awarded firm a chance to address our members and guests, Philip spoke about the meaning of our profession on the built environment. As a patron and client of the arts and architecture, he stressed the significance of staying true to our values, standing confident with clients, and educating the public to improve our communities, creating a culturally rich and pleasing environment.

Each of the seven winners spoke about the brilliant project teams and outstanding clients that enable the quality of work that was displayed. The range of projects demonstrates the different levels of client engagement; those who provide more freedom, and others who strive to maintain a rigid control, pushing designers beyond their comfort level. In the end the following firms were recognized and applauded for outstanding projects:

Hello Eastern New York! Happy Spring!

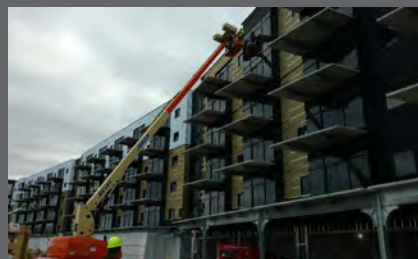
So here we are in May, and we have had two fantastic and very successful tours so far. Many of you attended the recent Rivers Casino tour, a 3-part for 3-credit event showcasing one our region's newest and most exciting developments.

Big thanks go out to JT Pollard and Mike Gamache of Re4orm Architecture for their tour of the 6-story mixed use building . We learned a great deal of the Mohawk Harbor Development and its part in the award of the Rivers Casino. For instance, did you know that the development, excluding the Casino and Parking Garage, will consist of 11 buildings? Within these buildings will ultimately reside approximately 200,000 sf of retail/office space, 2 hotels, 71 condos, and more than 250 apartment units. The Gilesie Group has been working on this development for nearly 7 years, and the program composition, location, and status as a brownfield development site all contributed to the eventual inclusion of the Rivers Casino.

Joe Scibetta of Rush Street, the Casino Owner and Operator, gave a very informative presentation of the design and construction process from the point of view of the Owner, followed by a tour of the facility with his design and facilities team. Sustainability and responsible development is important to Rush Street, and the Rivers Casino is one of two brownfield sites developed for their gaming facilities. In addition Rivers is on schedule to receive LEED Silver certification. We learned about the design goals and methods employed to maximize the location's flexibility and usability, as well as some tricks that are industry standard to get us – the eager customer – excited and engaged from the moment we entry the gaming floor. The project was constructed by Norwood-LeChase, a collaboration of the casino specialist and local talent . The delivery was fast-track design-build, and the project was completed in 14 months – under budget and ahead of schedule.

Thank you to all of those who were able to make it to this event! Keep your eyes peeled for more exciting CEU opportunities to come this summer, such as Fort Ticonderoga, Saratoga Race Course, and Great Escape.

AIA Grassroots 2017 Leadership Conference

I was fortunate enough to be able to attend the AIA Grassroots conference as the Eastern New York representative last month. This was a great opportunity to learn how to become a better Citizen Architect, to move beyond my own self-interests and to advocate for the greater good. This annual leadership retreat, held this year in Washington DC, was an exciting event where I met many Architects from outside our region, some from as far away as Japan. I had the opportunity to hear what is happening in our profession both on a state and national level and can attest to the fact that our AIA membership is filled with bold, outspoken, energetic people who are striving to make an impact especially in the wake of a contentious presidential election. Understandably, many feel compelled now more than ever to make their voices heard and so at Grassroots we sent members from across the country, and several from right here in upstate New York, to Capitol Hill to share our profession's concerns and viewpoints with members of Congress. Our New York legislators including Senator Chuck Schumer, Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, Congressman Dan Donovan, Congressman Hakeem Jeffries, and Congresswoman Carolyn Maloney need to hear what we stand for, what is important to Architects.

In addition to attending workshops on public outreach and leadership we took the opportunity on a warm seventy degree early March evening to get some fresh air and walk across town, past the White House, to visit the AIA National Headquarters.

In addition to the AIA National reception New York State held a regional meeting where component officers spoke about their local issues. The Central New York chapter talked about the I-81 challenge, a large urban design project underway in Syracuse aimed at taking down a highway viaduct which acts as a barrier dividing the city. Western New York officers spoke about the Buffalo Green Code, a sustainable land use plan that the city has adopted to guide development over the next 20 years. Although it seems obvious to us, we need to remind others that the involvement of Architects in these significant projects is imperative. Our various New York chapters are offering AIA members opportunities to make their voices heard. Here in Albany we are offering numerous programs and events over the course of the year, including some at the State Capital. I would urge you to attend the upcoming New York State Architects Advocacy Day on May 17th.

I attended an interesting workshop at Grassroots on how to talk about Architecture with clients and the public. You might have noticed recently that the AIA has been running some television commercials promoting our profession. "A 2014 Harris Poll listed Architecture as one of the highest-regarded professions in the United States". www.theharrispoll.com Architects are well respected but not understood. Public outreach is important for our profession and we need to learn how to hone our message in order to become more relatable to the public. Learning to communicate better is essential, our design work speaks volumes, but Architects also must have strong interpersonal skills. Open lines of communication with clients, contractors, and the public is the best form of marketing.
