

WHAT IF???

Several years ago AIA national began an emerging professional policy of offering complimentary membership for graduates of accredited schools of architecture. If the graduate provides a copy of their diploma with their membership application, they receive free membership with the AIA for 18 months. Recently both AIANYS and our local chapter decided to adopt this new graduate incentive promotion and we will be reaching out to RPI grads next spring.

This policy reflects the broader goals of national's repositioning initiative - the goal of which is to remake AIA as a visionary organization focused on serving members. As an example, AIA national recently made the momentous decision to move toward a bicameral method

of governance: a smaller board of directors will pursue a defined, strategic set of fiduciary concerns, while a larger council of elected members will address the profession's critical concerns such as education and public outreach.



There are a lot of changes at the national level, but what about the local level?

Throughout the entire year our board has considered how we can achieve some of the repositioning goals at home. The AIAENY officers have planned a strategy session at the end of the year to brainstorm our next actions, strategies and goals for 2014 and beyond. It should be full of "What If?" moments. Here are some examples:



Project Spotlight The Brass Residence, Burden Lake

3tarchitects

3tarchitects, based out of Albany, does not often have the opportunity to work on custom, single family residential projects. So when Principal and Founder, Scott Townsend was approached by longtime friends to design a custom lake house on Burden Lake, it was hard to turn down....but we did. Several times, actually. While we are more than capable, the unique challenges of single family residential do not align with 3t's business model, making profitability on these types of projects difficult. Over the course of several meetings (and excellent bottles of wine), persistence finally won out, but the real clincher was the Owners' insistence that they wanted a true 3t design, and trusted us implicitly to meet and exceed their visions. The rest, as they say, is history.

The design criteria given by the clients, Rob and Ruth Brass, were simple and straight forward.

They wanted a camp that embraced and captured the natural elements of the site while providing the

comforts and amenities of a contemporary, year round residence. Long term, they hoped to have a home to use as their primary residence



once their children have grown and moved on. Given the site and context, the design emerged naturally, as is evidenced from the consistency from initial design through final execution.

The Brass Residence is a four bedroom, 2,300 square foot lake house, perched on a narrow sloping site overlooking Burden Lake. The house is situated mid-site, framed by natural rock outcroppings, lush vegetation, and tall trees. This placement takes advantage of the existing stone retaining walls, located between the lake and the house, and acting as a base for the new structure. Upon entering the property from the road above the lake, the view is revealed incrementally as one approaches and walks along the bridge leading to the fully glazed second level entry. Inside,

the view becomes fully appreciated through a wall of glass facing the lake. Once inside, the bridge is an important element as a division between the public and private sides of the house and as a unifying element between the two predominant gable roofs. This house, above all, prioritizes the experiential quality of interior space with reverence for the lake and its surroundings. Credits:







Excelsior Awards Program Launched

A committee of local AIA governmental architects worked with Co-Chair and past AIANYS President, Kelly Hayes McAlonie, current President Eric Gishow, and AIANYS Executive Director Georgi Ann Bailey to create the Excelsior Design Awards program focusing on excellence in New York State public architecture. Eligible projects are limited to fully or partially funded New York State projects. Projects may be owned by the state, a municipality, a non-profit or a private entity but they must serve the public to qualify. The Planning Committee consists of Co-Chair Sandra Daigler of the Dormitory Authority, Anna

Campas of the Office of General Services, Chris Lopez of the State University Construction Fund and Chuck Szuberla of the State Education Department.

There will also be three Professional Awards for individuals who have furthered excellence in public architecture. They include 1) Daniel Patrick Moynihan Award for Public Officials and Non-Architects 2) Nelson Rockefeller Award for a Public-Sector Architect and 3) H.H. Richardson Award for a Private-Sector Architect who is an AIA member.

The timeline is as follows: November 1, 2013 Call for entries; February 1, 2014 Submission deadline; April 28, 2014 Awards event in Albany, NY.

New Psychiatric Facility Receives LEED Gold Certification

architecture+, a design and service oriented architecture and planning firm in Troy, New York, is pleased to announce that the

Worcester Recovery Center and Hospital located in Worcester, Massachusetts, has been awarded LEED Gold Certification for New Construction.

The LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Green Building Rating System, developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC), is the internationally accepted benchmark for design, construction and operation of high-performance green buildings. Buildings constructed to LEED standards are designed to be more efficient with a lower environmental impact.

The 320-bed acute-care psychiatric hospital is the most advanced of its kind to date. It melds state-of-the-art therapeutic programs and architecture such that the building becomes a recovery-focused clinical tool. Familiar elements (house, neighborhood, and downtown) are employed to reflect the range of environments in which people live. Sustainable design features include energy performance that is projected as 24% better than required by the Energy Code, with a projected water use reduction of 32%. Voluminous demolished masonry was crushed on site and used as fill to expand the existing plateau on the site. Other innovative sustainable features include a co-generation system producing electricity while providing waste heat to heat water; hot water distribution that utilizes heat tape in lieu of storage tanks with pumps and return loop; and pulse-power technology for treatment of cooling system water without chemicals. An educational program was developed, reminding occupants to conserve electricity and water through a staff handbook, patient pamphlet, and message boards comparing historic and current usage.

This project was designed by Ellenzweig and architecture+, Associate Architects. Francis Murdock Pitts, FAIA, who lead the architecture+ team, is internationally known for his work with psychiatric facilities. He has been working with other architects and medical professionals since the early 1980s to advance the ideas exemplified in the new Worcester facility.
