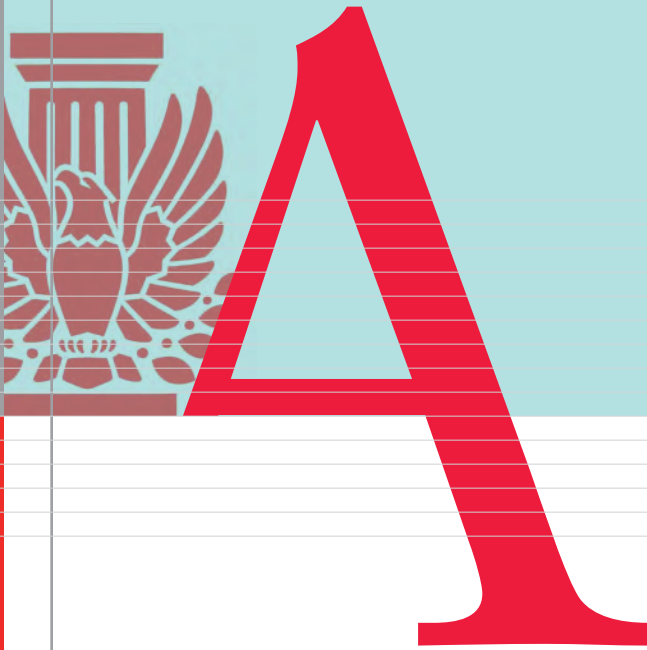


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AIAENY: Year In Review

In February of this year I attended the Grassroots 2016 AIA Leadership Conference in Detroit. Unlike in past years which focused extensively on lobbying of our congressional delegations, this year's conference focused on leadership issues and the national Membership Alignment. One of the sessions that I attended related to our emerging professionals and how we can nurture them in their careers, and make AIA more relevant to them. As a direct result, AIAENY started an Emerging Professionals committee under the leadership of Brennan Drake and Mike Goard. This year we held two mixers and have purchased the study materials for the new licensing exam which people will be able to borrow from the Chapter. This will be a huge financial help. In the coming year, the committee intends to begin study sessions as well.

There is so much that the Board of AIAENY wants to do for our members but we need YOU!

We need to reinvigorate our K-12 Education committee which was started under Anna Campas' leadership and provided architecture books to our children's schools and architects into classrooms and career days to talk about the profession.

The Annual Design Awards which showcases the best of our Chapter's work, is a great social event and public outreach opportunity. We are exploring ways to give significant public exposure to our next round of winners through the media and public showing after the awards.

Lobby Day, which occurs annually at the New York State Capitol, is a great way to meet your local lawmakers and help influence legislation that is of vital importance to architects working in New York State.

In June, we held our Annual Boat Cruise aboard the Captain JP. In addition to great food, fellowship, and the opportunity to meet with a number of vendors, our program included a presentation by Troy Deputy Mayor Monica Kurzejeski and recent Planning Commission Chair Barbara Nelson, AIA on the development of Troy's new Comprehensive Plan.
