Frank Genese, AIA

Frank Genese AIA is an architect and civic leader based on Long Island, New York. He earned his Bachelor of Professional Studies in Architecture and Master of Architecture from the State University of New York at Buffalo, after graduating from the Bronx High School of Science in 1976.

Professionally, Genese is principal partner of the architectural firm N2 Design+Architecture, PC in Port Washington, New York. Prior to joining N2, he was Vice President at D&B Engineers & Architects, PC; Vice President for Capital & Facilities Management at the Queens Library; Vice President and Architect of the Garden at The New York Botanical Garden; served as head of facilities and operations at the New York Institute of Technology (NYIT), and the City University of New York. He has also held various positions with the government of New York City, including the Office of the Mayor, New York City Department of Design and Construction, and the New York City Department of General Services.

In the public realm, Genese has been an active figure in local government as the Deputy Mayor of the Village of Flower Hill, NY. He also serves as Chairman of the Town of North Hempstead Historic Landmarks Preservation Commission and is involved with other local boards and community organizations.
